All travellers who develop relevant symptoms (for example respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, cough, fever) however mild, within 14 days of returning or transitioning from mainland China, Thailand, Japan, Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia or Macau should **NOT** attend the Parsonage Surgery, but should remain at home and immediately call NHS 111, inform them of your recent travel to the country and follow their advice.

More information is available by logging onto gov.uk/coronavirus - updated daily You can help too. Germs can live on some surfaces for hours. To protect yourself and others:

Extended Access Hub

GP and Nurse appointments are available evenings and weekends to provide an extended access service for patients of practices in Stortford, Sawbridgeworth and surrounding areas.

You can book appointments to see a GP, Nurse or other health professional between 6.30 - 8pm and weekends from 9am - 1pm.

Appointments booked either in advance or on the day will be held in different locations across the area. Staff offer appointments giving venue/time/clinician choices to suit patient needs.

Co-Location with South Street Surgery - latest

NHS England funding has been approved to refurbish and reconfigure the Kitwood Unit. This offers us more clinical rooms and a larger waiting area in our half of the unit.

Dr J Takhar outlined the co-location plans to the PPG. A start date for the work and details are awaited of how and where Surgery will be sited within the building during the changes.

The other half of the Kitwood Unit will be utilized separately by South Street Surgery.

CCG PatientSurvey 'You said - we listened'

Patients recently took part in The Clinical Commissioning Group for East & North Hertfordshire (CCG) survey. This covered the design and development of services, and quality of provision. Of our patients, 2.93% responded. The CCG target rate was 2%.

Highlights of good practice:

Medical staff are professional & caring Welcoming & friendly culture Good access to emergency appointments

Areas identified for improvement:

Long wait for Non-Urgent appointments Telephone contact difficult at peak times Promotion & provision of extended access service.

Outcome: These findings were summarized by the PPG and were then shared with the Surgery & those issues identified were reviewed. Response/Actions undertaken by Parsonage Surgery were fed back to the CCG and the PPG. The full detail of these responses can be viewed in the February PPG Minutes

Health essentials - reminder

It's important that vaccines are given on-time for the best protection. If you or your child missed a vaccine, contact your GP to catch up.

There is an excellent online guide on types of vaccines and schedules for each vaccine for babies, children 1-15, adults, pregnant women, and extra vaccines for at-risk people.

Parsonage surgery offers the **pneumonia vaccine** to protect against serious and potentially fatal pneumococcal infections. Also, a vaccine to prevent shingles, a common, painful skin disease is available on the NHS to people in their 70s.

Winter 2019/20 Influenza: Parsonage Surgery continue to offer influenza vaccinations to eligible patients up to 31.03.20. Adult Flu and Child Nasal Flu Vaccine supplies arrived throughout October (we have strict ordering controls for nasal flu, appointments are booked dependent on delivery dates and available vaccines). Eligible patients can book flu vaccination, just call the reception team on 01279 827608 after 10am, or request an appointment for the flu vaccine via email - <u>parsonageadmin@nhs.net</u> and we will call you back to arrange a suitable date. Please also advise if you wish to decline and reception team will update your record.
